## Advisory: Lowell, Dracut, Methuen

### Roadway Construction with Temporary Lane Shifts and Closures on Route 110

*Temporary lane shifts and closures on Route 110 will occur daily, Monday through Friday, through end of November*

**LOWELL/DRACUT/METHUEN** - The Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) is announcing it will be implementing temporary lane shifts and lane closures on sections of Route 110 in Lowell, Dracut and Methuen, starting at Alexander Circle in Methuen and extending to west of Bradley Street in Lowell. The lane shifts and lane closures will continue daily, Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., continuing until the end of November. One lane of traffic on Route 110 in each direction will be maintained at all times.

The temporary lane shifts and lane closures are necessary to allow the contractor to safely and effectively perform roadway construction operations.

Police details will be used to direct traffic on Route 110 and the intersections affected and there will be appropriate signage and messaging in place to guide drivers through the work zone.

The work is being conducted as part of a \$15.5 million project to resurface and perform related work along approximately 6.3 miles of roadway on this section of Route 110.

Drivers traveling through the affected areas should expect delays, reduce speed, and use caution.

All scheduled work is weather dependent and subject to change without notice.
